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
Teenagers are not only the future but the present

A course designed to inspire and equip the next generation of leaders to drive sustainable change

For over 15 years, Earth Charter International (ECI) has been engaging, motivating, training, and empowering young leaders, aged between 18 and 30 years old, from all regions of the world to commit to processes of social transformation.

Building on this experience, we are introducing the "Emerging Earth Leaders" course, thoughtfully designed to empower teenagers with the knowledge and skills needed to become visionary leaders in sustainability. Grounded in the foundational principles of the Earth Charter, this course prepares participants to initiate and lead transformative projects contributing to a more just, sustainable, and peaceful world.





About the course

The course offers a learning experience that will help teens **develop the knowledge and skills to become effective ethical/sustainability leaders with the ability to impact future generations**. This course is developed in a highly collaborative and multicultural environment fostered through discussion forums and group activities. The methodology includes recorded and live sessions. It involves reading theoretical material and case studies; watching videos followed by comprehension questions; engaging in discussions of sustainability, leadership, and ethics; writing short reflections and weekly exercises; and culminates with a final project developed by each participant.

Course Components:

- 6 weekly online modules
- Online and facilitated
- Language: English
- Weekly discussion forums
- Collaborative learning communities

Course Details:

- **Duration:** 7 weeks
- **Live Sessions/Facilitated Class Time:** 7 hours (1 per week)
- **Self-Study:** 18 hours (3 per week)
- **Final Project/Essay:** 5 hours
- **Total Projected Time Investment:** 30 hours

Course objectives

This training provides a space for participants to:

- Foster leadership, communication and inner-development skills associated with agents of change.
- Increase their understanding of our interconnected global challenges and how they relate to participants' lives and communities.
- Identify signs of hope for the well-being of the Earth community.
- Explore their worldview and engage possible worldviews associated with a just, sustainable, and peaceful world.
- Deepen their understanding of the values and principles of the Earth Charter as they reflect a worldview of sustainability.
- Learn about systems thinking and real-world applications.

Audience

This 7-week online course is for teens ages 14-17 and offers a hopeful and multicultural community where students can nurture their **leadership skills, values, and principles of sustainability.**

To participate in the course, they must:

- Desire to learn about current global challenges and how to turn conscience into action.
- Have a good command of the language in which the course is being held.
- Be willing to apply and share the knowledge acquired within their context.



Course Completion Requirements

To successfully complete this course, participants are required to:

- Actively participate in 80% of the sessions through the forums and live meetings.
- Develop a final project successfully.

After successful completion of this course, participants will:

- Receive a certificate



- Be invited to join the Earth Charter Network, an international online community of motivated individuals turning conscience into action.
